How Can I Support My Child?

TOP TIPS FROM OTHER PARENTS

- Expectations be realistic, make it manageable.
- Plan together and review what stage they are at.
- Use a calendar specifically for their work.
- Learn their learning style what works for them? (writing out notes/exam questions/papers recording revision notes/working with another person/mind maps) etc.
- Reminding them that nerves are normal.

PRACTICAL THINGS YOU CAN DO

- Giving them a space to work time alone if they share a room etc.
- Organising times for work with son/daughter that work for them.
- Ensuring they have resources paper/ post-its/ revision cards.
- Make sure they have 'down' time and exercise.
- Ensure they have a healthy diet.
- Ensure they have enough sleep.
- Reminding them that nerves are normal.

REWARDS (that do not cost much but that your child wants ...)

- Extra time out.
- Extra time on XBox/Playstation.
- Choice of meal/takeaway.
- Sleepover/friends round.
- Let them off chores.
- Phone credit.
- Money towards something they want to buy.

SIX THINGS TO MOTIVATE YOUR CHILD THAT COST NOTHING

- 1. **Pay Attention** Parents often assume that teenagers do not need the same amount of attention they received when they were younger.
- Communicate They need to be able to tell you if they are struggling.
- 3. Don't make excuses for them.
- 4. **Recognise Achievements** i.e a completed piece of coursework.
- 5. **Celebrate Strengths** Admire their work/test result.
- 6. **Never Give Up** <u>You</u> are their rock.
